78 PARISH WAR MEMORIAL

Trevor Scadeng confirmed that the paving slabs around the war memorial needed relaying and Mr Lee agreed to look into it.

79 ASHTON HAYES SPORTS AND RECREATION PROJECT

An update from Andrew Garman relating to recreational field was read out. Ashton Hayes Sports and Recreation Association asked whether the Parish Council would consider organizing a loan to help towards the development of a sports pavilion on recreational field. The Parish Council had previously agreed that it would not get itself into debt for the recreational field project.

Mr Charnock confirmed installing solar panels on the proposed pavilion could generate some income which could be used towards any building costs.

RESOLVED:

1. Mr Charnock to find out what income could be generated from the installation of solar panels on the roof of the proposed sports pavilion.
2. The Clerk to find out details on how the Parish Council can

loan money from the Public Works Loan Board.

80 UPDATE FROM EACH THEME LEAD AND SUPPORTING
COUNCIL AND AGREE NEXT STEPS

COMMUNITY LIFE – MR SCADENG

Mr Scadeng confirmed that he was currently compiling a list of all the activities that currently took place in Ashton Hayes.

ENVIRONMENT ENRICHMENT - GARRY CHARNOCK

Mr Charnock confirmed as part of the Going Carbon Netural Project a grant had been applied for to purchase a community electric car.

RECREATION AND LEISURE – DAVE LEE

Mr Lee confirmed that 70/80% of the actions within the action plan for this theme would be achieved through the creation of the new recreational field. Mr Lee agreed to report back to the Parish Council on the details of the adult gym.

ROADS AND PEDESTRIANS – HUGO DEYMEN

Mr Deynem reported that this group had met twice and had three new members. He reported some of the highway problems that had been identified in the Parish Plan were more perceptual issues than actual reality problems.

81 COMMUNITY SHOP UPDATE

Mr Scadeng reported that the Community Shop had made a profit in the region of £800. This was excellent news as it was not supposed to make a profit for the first 18 months. During the recent hot spell meat and milk had been ordered on a daily basis. A lot more volunteers were needed to help during July. Thanks were expressed to Mrs D Deynem for all her hard work since she took up her post of Shop Manager. Ashton Hayes Community

Shop Steering Group had been asked to mentor other potential Community Shop initiatives. Mr Scadeng proposed that any profit from the Community Shop could be redeployed back into the Community.

RESOLVED: The Parish Council to receive an official update on the Community Shop finances once the pending stock take had been undertaken.

82 GOING CARBON NEUTRAL PROJECT

Mr Charnock confirmed that due to his efforts in the Going Carbon Neutral Project he had recently won Business Leader Initiative Award.

83 WEBSITE

Mr Charnock reported that the Parish Council's website was receiving on average 5 visitors per day.

84 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

The Parish Council were informed that the Cricket Club were holding its Annual bar-b-que on 21 August at the WI Hall.

Mr Holland reported that Ashton Hayes Theatre Club had received 5 nominations and won 3 awards for its recent production of 'The Crucible'.
